- ❖ CalWorks criteria: Has to be CalWorks client; first time mom, pregnant or with a child less than 24 months. The next group would be expanded services population with one or more child. DHA does outreach.
- ❖ Steve Wirtz asked that a list of indicators be sent to the Evaluation Committee for review. This information will be sent, but it is still in DRAFT form.
- ❖ Olivia Kasirye requested a copy of the Birth & Beyond report (Americorp) also be distributed to the committee members.
- ❖ Olivia Kasirye also requested a timeline adjustment for items distributed to committee members so that there is more time allotted for review of any documents. Steve Wirtz stated that in this case "special" meetings may have to be scheduled in order to meet the adjusted timelines.
