This meeting took place via Zoom due to Covid-19 restrictions and to adhere to the County's policy on social distancing.

- Call to order and Roll Call
 Action: Meeting was called to order at 1:03PM. A quorum was established and introductions by attendees.
- 2. Public Comments on Off-Agenda Items **Action:** None.
- 3. Approve Draft Action Summary of January 31, 2020 **Action:** Smith/Wirtz. Approved as recommended.
- 4. Receive General Evaluation Update from ASR ASR provided updates for a four month period. The updates included:
 - RAACD quarter 2 data
 - Birth and Beyond evaluation report to be presented at the July Evaluation Committee meeting. B&B currently reviewing the report and providing feedback.
 - School Readiness Special Studies to be presented in July.

Action: Schedule follow-up meeting with DCFAS to continue discussion around high-risk families and how to best serve them.

- 5. Staff Update Staff updated the Committee on the work being done to develop a Client Intake Portal with Persimmony. Staff also shared that contractors were asked not to submit quarter 3 performance measures report and to include the data with 4th quarter reports which are due on July 31st. Staff also shared information about First 5 California's emergency supply and supplies from Baby2Baby to be distributed to our community partners.
- 6. Black Mothers United Quarter 2 Report Action: Reviewed and discussed the information provided. Chair Wirtz asked if we can look at the various education and media campaigns to see if they are making a difference. Staff explained that being that they are community wide

campaigns we could look at clicks/visits to the webpage. Staff also explained that it's not a narrow reach, however, we could look at quality of health care for those receiving implicit biased training. There was also discussion on clients' experiences during Covid-19. A possibility is to add a question to the exit interview about the mother's experience delivering during Covid-19.

- School Readiness Special Study Family Support and Engagement Action: Reviewed and discussed the information provided. The findings will be shared at the July Evaluation Committee meeting.
