

## Home Visiting Programs Eligibility/ Family Support Services Referrals and Continuum of Services

At any entry point, all families should be connected to an FRC and/or CIL (if African American) and a home visiting program. Additionally, eligible families can be referred to co-serving home visiting programs, with a particular focus, and any other needed or requested supports on page 2.

### Home Visiting Programs for Special Populations

At any entry point, families that are eligible for home visiting programs for special populations should first be offered or referred to the program that is most specialized in the family's needs. Families can be assessed and triaged based on location, capacity and/or the need or desire for a nurse. Families with a desire or need for a nurse will be triaged by any of the Public Health (PH) Programs below. At the end of program term, families will be referred to Birth & Beyond home visiting for continued services.
